The first article was written by **Anugerah Yuka Asmara and Retno Kusumastuti** entitled Innovation Policy Implementation in Indonesia: Perspective of Triple Helix. This article discusses that in Indonesia, public policy for innovation is not easily implemented. The article explains key determinant factors hindering innovation policy in Indonesia, particularly to answer why the classic issue of innovation problem is still unresolved in recent condition.

Winda Anestya Ayunda et al., present an article that proposes framework modifications to assess both the implementation and evaluation of IPs in Indonesian agriculture systems, including identification of challenges and opportunities for further research, policy and development investments in sustainable intensification.

Rendi Febrianda presents an article entitled Mobile Apps Technology Adoption in Agriculture Sector of Indonesia: An Analysis of Empirical View from Public R&D Agency. This article aims to review a framework related to diffusion and adoption of digital farming technologies that integrating farm level evidence then compare it with local data based on the empirical view of public agricultural R&D agency.

Jessica Chandra Chairunnisa, et al., present the fourth article entitled Effect of capital investment on the level of internationalization of companies in ASEAN – 5 periods 2009-2018. This article presents the effect of capital investment on the level of internationalization and determines the effect of a larger capital investment and a larger company size on the relationship between the two of them in companies in Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Thailand and Singapore.

Ardanareswari Ayu Pitaloka and Arief Priyo Nugroho present The state of healthcare application (HA) utilization in Indonesia during the pandemic covid-19. Digital transformation in healthcare services in Indonesia has several challenges in its development. Apart from legal and ethical issues, there are social, political, and cultural contexts that make existing transformations at risk of creating conflict relations in health services.

Finally, **Maulana Akbar and Ria Hardiyati** present The Absorption of HRST from Technology-Based Companies of Indonesia. This article discusses the absorption of the technology-based industry in Indonesia through data on job vacancies from technology-based companies in Indonesia over a period of one year.
